The foundation's investment portfolio in 2004 followed the resolution of the Fifth Meeting of the Board of Directors which stipulated that at least 50 percent of the fund be invested in money market and government bonds, and at most 45 percent be invested in risky assets. At the end of 2004, the actual percentage of investment in risky assets was 42.2 percent.

In 2004, we increased our allocation in REITs and began to invest in commodity related assets. The dividend yield of high-dividend equity and REITs was still higher than nominal bonds. Hence, the Sixth Meeting of the Board of Directors passed the resolution that the percentage of risky assets may increase from 45 percent to 50 percent.

At the end of 2004, the total assets of the Foundation were US\$102,553,635. The total assets included current assets US\$98,784,828, fixed assets US\$3,755,668, and other assets US\$13,139. (See Balance Sheet)
